KODAK ADAPTABILITY

Kodaks can be used for taking snap-shot, time exposures or flashlight pictures. They can be used for hand or tripod work. Seven styles use either roll film or glass plates and can be focused with the index or on the ground glass. The No. 5 and No. 6 Folding Kodaks are adapted to stereoscopic work.

KODAK CONSTRUCTION.

Perfection in every part is our only standard in camera construction.

The Lens. Kodaks have the best lenses. The definition of every one is examined under the microscope and no Kodak is sent out with an inferior lens.

The Shutters. Kodak shutters are built on scientific principles, are easy to regulate, positive in action, simple in construction and **reliable**.

Roll Holders. We own the fundamental patents covering the roll holders and rollable film which have been recently sustained in the U. S. Courts, and are therefore not handicapped in introducing new improvements. The roll holder as embodied in the Kodak is the only correct principle for a magazine camera. *Any number of exposures may be taken out and developed without waiting to finish the roll.*

Weight and Capacity. Kodaks have a capacity of from 24 to 250 exposures. A No. 4 Kodak loaded for 250 pictures 4 x 5 weighs only 5½ pounds. A magazine camera and an equivalent in glass plates weigh over 40 pounds.

Testing. Every Kodak is tested in actual use and so adjusted that every part works in harmony with every other part. Our system of tests insures a camera that will give perfect satisfaction to the operator.

Loaded for Use. Kodaks are always sold loaded ready for instant use. Remember this in comparing the cost with other instruments.

New Folding Kodaks.

The new model folding Kodaks embody all the improvements that brains can devise and money perfect.

Fitted with iris diaphragm shutter having a range of automatic exposure from $\frac{1}{100}$ of a second to 3 seconds.

The lens is instantly removable and can be replaced by a wide angle lens, the cells of which fit the same shutter.

A double swing back and sliding front are among recent improvements.

The roll holder has a dark slide and is interchangeable with our plate holders.

All the advantages of a complete view camera combined with the compactness of a Kodak.

THE KODET

The Kodet might be called a first cousin to the Kodak. It was especially designed for those who desire a glass plate camera that can be used with films by the mere addition of a roll holder but do not care to invest in a \$50.00 or \$60.00 instrument, such as our Junior and Folding Kodaks.

Like the Kodaks they are well made in every way and are carefully tested in actual use. Kodets have a new improved shutter, the finest adjustments and are handsomely finished. They can be furnished with single or double lenses.

Made in two styles, "Regular" and "Folding."

Transparent Film.

Our new Transparent film is equal in quality to the best brands of plates on the market. It is very rapid and is free from bubbles and other imperfections. **It will not tear or frill.**

Every package is now stamped with the date beyond which the film should not be put to important use without testing. Customers are thus insured against film that may have lost a portion of its speed or quality through extreme age.
