

ON THE NEXT PAGE IS AN AD FROM THE SAME MAGAZINE, THIS TIME THE OCTOBER 1953 ISSUE. IT IS FOR THE MODEL "S" AND ITS LENSES, PLUS THE CINE-NIKKORS AND 75MM. AND 120MM. LENSES,

POSSIBLY FOR 120 AND PLATE BACK CAMERAS. WHAT IS REALLY SPECIAL ABOUT THIS AD IS THE 50MM. F1.4 NIKKOR ON THE CAMERA. THE BODY NUMBER IS 6104326(?), WHICH IS THE FIRST THIRD OF THE MITHIN "S" PRODUCTION, PLUS REMEMBER THAT THIS AD APPEARED IN 1953. SO WHAT IS IT BER WITH A "BLACK" 1.4 NIKKOR???????? AND AN ALL BLACK ONE TO BOOT????? UNFORTUNATELY THE SERIAL NUMBER OF THE LENS IS NOT READABLE. IT COULD BE FROM A BATCH OF F1.4 NIKKORS THAT I HAVE HEARD OF IN THE 331000 TO ABOUT 332000 RANGE. THIS IS VERY EARLY FOR A BLACK LENS AND MAY BE PART OF AN EXPERIMENTAL BATCH.

NOTE THAT THE AD ON THE REAR COVER IS FOR THE NIKON ONE AND MENTIONS THE 50MM. F3.5 NIKKOR.






