The experimental model on Fig-1 has been described as advertisement on the magazine of "Kohga Gekkan" in Oct 1947. According to the poor paper quality and printing technic of the magazine itself, it made it so difficult to read the body number of the experimental model camera on the magazine. however in general, thay say the number could be "6094" supposedly. Further it is indicated on the article of page 30 as "Nikon will be issued very soon". therefore I'm really interested in real number of the camera. I hereby take a guess the body number and lens number with my own technic. Hope you will enjoy it.



Making a printing of the picture.

(A) Enlarge. (with suitable size.)

(B) Adjustment of contrast. (Prefer most suitable contrast to see.) Enlarge the photograph with the best condition by XEROX copy machine, and read it after complete the adjustment of contrast. (sharpness may be detarmined by tonner powder on XEROX copy machine, therefore, it could be better than photograph, in some case.)

A strong point on experimental model.

- (1) Difference of logo. (small size logo on front view, refer to Fig-3.)
- (2) A-R lever is located conversely.
- (3) No ∞ lock lever.
- (4) Eight screws on front plate. (six screws, -- CONTAX II type.)
- (5) Body number is indicated as No XXXY.
- (6) Distance scale -- meter.

After carefull consideration, it could be read as No 6091. (refer to Fig-2 for reason.)

Fig-2 indicates it can be assumed that, it is illuminated from the left side of upper, because there is a ghost on point "X".






Reasoning of lens number. XoYO91 -- (refer to Fig-4.) As you are well aware of the reading is so much difficult to compare "O" with "O" of NIKKOR, also compare "1" with "1" of 1:2. "9" looks somthing like "8". since it can not be read the lower part of the figure. next to impossible to identify the "X" and "Y". "O" of next to "X" can be read with much difficulty. Therefore, I reached to the conclusion of lens number 6091. Further, the advertisement of the Nikon is described on this magazine. (refer to Fig-5.)







The title of "Kohga Gekkan" in English.





Nikon the first production number is No.6091. However this might say unlucky camera. since it never had chance to have proper inspection at last. But its outside view is still remained in photo. Unfortunately they considered that was unuseful, but I don't know when they determined it, Then, the first production was being disposed with other metallic dusts. As soon as I heard the news with much surprise. I jumpped up. And I have picked up the destroyed parts. Those parts have been kept with me for twenty years as my impotant parts until Nippon Kogaku Fifty anniversary celebration. By the time, I have determined to present same to Mr. Masahiko Fukeda who made "The Nikon". These parts are namely main body itself and upper cover with production number. However these parts seem like almost garbage. These had no range finder. But it had been mounted light leaking protection plate itself on it. I can easily imagine how they hardly fought against light leaking problem.


BY CHANCE I ALSO RECIEVED A LETTER FROM AKITO TAMLA THAT DISCUSSES THE VERY SAME ARTI-CLES AS DOES TSUYOSHI KONNO. I HAVE INCLUDED IT AS WELL.

FROM INFORMATION AVAILABLE THERE WERE THREE EXPERIMENTAL MODELS OF THE CAMERA FROM LATE 1946 THRU EARLY 1948.NIPPON KO-GAKU WAS TO RELEASE PHOTOS AND A DESCRIPTION OF THE FIRST ONE TO THE JAPANESE PHOTOGRAPHIC PRESS BUT THIS NEVER HAPPENED.

THE SECOND MODEL APPEARED IN THE OCTOBER 1947 ISSUE OF THE MAGAZINE "KOHGA GEKKAN" WITH A BRIEF DESCRIPTION. IT CAN BE ASSUMED THAT THIS CAMERA WAS MADE AROUND MARCH 1947.IT LACK-ED THE INFINITY RELEASE BY THE FOCUSING WHEEL AND THE SERIAL NUMBER IS POSSIBLY NO.6094. IN-STEAD OF THE N-K LOGO THE TOP PLATE IS ENGRAVED "NIPPON KO-GAKU TOKYO" IN BLOCK LETTERS. THE LENS NUMBER IS ALMOST AS-SUREDLY NO.6091.....


THE THIRD MODEL WAS CLOSER TO THE ACTUAL PRODUCTION VERSION EXCEPT IT STILL LACKED THE N-K LOGO ON THE TOP PLATE. THE SER- IAL NUMBER COULD BE NO. 6097 BUT MEMBERS OF THE NIKON CLUB JAPAN CAN NOT AGREE ON THE LAST DIGIT (REFER TO FIGURE 6 AND 7 IN KONNO ARTICLE). WHAT DO YOU THINK??? THE THIRD MODEL WAS PICTURED IN THE BOOK "CLASSIC CAMERAS" BY K. KITANO.

******* THANK YOU TSUYOSHI AND AKITO FOR ABSOLUTELY FASCINATING IN-FORMATION ABOUT WHAT ARE PRO-BABLY THE VERY FIRST NIKONS EVER MADE. IT IS INTERESTING TO SEE SUCH INFORMATION BEING MADE AVAILABLE AT THIS TIME. I WOULD HAVE GIVEN MY RIGHT ARM FOR SUCH INFO ONLY 3 OR 4 YEARS AGO AND WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN ABLE TO OBTAIN IT. EVEN THOUGH NIKON DID USE CERTAIN "F" PARTS ON THESE LATE "S3" BODIES, THE SHUTTER DIAL SWITCH ORIGINAL) IS INTERESTING (IF SINCE THE RF METER GEAR WHEEL WILL NOT INDEX WITH THE "F" DIAL.MY WIFE HAS TRANSLATED THE IDEOGRAPHS ON JOHN ANGLES MIL-ITARY NIKON (NHS 4). LOOSELY TRANSLATED IT IS:

NO. 439

MANUFACTURED MAY 1941 JAPAN OPTICAL MFG. CO.,LTD. MY VACATION SLIDES SHOT WITH AN SP CAME BACK RECENTLY AND I NEVER CEASE TO BE AMAZED BY THE QUALITY. CONTEMPORARY CAMERAS TRASH BY COMPARISON. THE ARE NIKON LEGEND WAS BUILT ON THE "SP" AND "F" AND IT IS SAD THAT THERE IS NO PLACE IN TODAYS MARKET FOR SUCH STANDARDS. HEREWITH IS MY SUBSCRIPTION RE-"NHS". A TRIVIAL NEWAL TO THE OBSERVATION FOR THOSE WHO HAVE NOT ALREADY FOUND OUT: DO NOT TRY TO FIT A CONTEMPORARY NIKON 62MM. FILTER ON THE 50MM. F1.1 RF NIKKOR----THE FILTER GLASS BOTTOMS OUT AGAINST THE FRONT ELEMENT BEFORE THE THREAD IS SNUG.


A COUPLE OF INTERESTING 135MM. F4.0 NIKKORS CONSTITUTE OUR ODDS N ENDS FEATURE THIS ISSUE. AKITO TAMLA SENDS US TWO PHO-TOS OF A LENS OWNED BY A MEMBER OF THE "NIKON CLUB JAPAN". IT LENS NO. 904666 IN SCREW IS MOUNT. EVERYTHING APPEARS NOR-MAL UNTIL YOU VIEW ONE OF THE APERTURE RINGS. THIS LENS ONLY STOPS DOWN TO F11.....WHERE IS F16? THERE IS NO ROOM FOR IT ... WHOEVER ENGRAVED THIS ONE MUST HAVE HAD A BAD DAY. NOTE THAT F5.6 IS ENGRAVED TWICE?? A VERY INTERESTING ERROR IN-DEED. THE SECOND LENS WAS SUB-MITTED BY JOHN ANGLE. HE ALLOWED TO PHOTOGRAPH IT AND SHARE ME IT WITH THE MEMBERSHIP. ALL PRE-VIOUSLY RECORDED 135MM. F4.0 NIKKORS HAVE BEEN IN TWO BATCH TYPES.....611 AND 904. THE 904 TYPE HAS BEEN KNOWN FOR QUITE SOME TIME WHILE THE 611 TYPE WAS FIRST SEEN ABOUT FIVE OR SO YEARS AGO. WELL FOLKS, WE NOW HAVE YET ANOTHER SERIES TO SEEK SHOWN IS LENS NO. 523799 OUT. WHICH IS THE VERY FIRST I HAVE EVER HEARD OF. IT APPEARS TO BE IDENTICAL TO THE 904 TYPE AS OPPOSED TO THE FARLIER AT LENSES. HOWEVER, THE STYLE OF EN-GRAVING IS MORE LIKE THE EARLY 135MM. F3.5 LENSES APPEARING TO SLIGHTLY MORE MODERN THAN BE THAT SEEN ON THE 904 SERIES. AFTER EXAMINING THIS LENS VERY THAT IT IS A CLOSELY I FEEL VERY, VERY LATE SPECIMEN THAT COULD EVEN HAVE BEEN ASSEMBLED AFTER PRODUCTION OF THE F3.5 LENSES HAD ALREADY BEGUN. ANY WAY YOU LOOK AT IT IT IS A VERY INTERESTING ITEM THAT ILLU-STRATES SOMETHING I HAVE AL-WAYS SAID..... 


