LD albums and daguerrotypes, the family trinkets, interesting period furniture and pewterware—all these, in themselves, are records of the

past that are so eagerly sought to-day. How proudly we exhibit the grandfather's clock, that really was our grandfather's, and the silk dress that grandmother wore at her wedding. And yet our grandparents gave little thought to the importance of preserving them for future generations.

Photographs are the one and only universal language easily interpreted, in a general way, by anyone. But it is the intimate details—the eternal when—that makes them more valuable as time changes the customs and manners of the day.

The Kodak always has been the means of making and retaining interesting pictorial records, but it remains for the Autographic feature to supply the complete record that will identify the picture, as long as it is intact. So Autographic

Photography has come to add still further charm and practical utility to the pleasures of picture-making by the Kodak system.

Pictures that tell the story of one's vacation; of the trip by automobile or train; from baby's first journey downstairs, to the toddling nursery days and when he trudges off to school—of these simple little everyday events, there are limitless opportunities for the Kodak. But when this same boy has grown to manhood, these Autographic pictures will have become as valuable to someone as the old family trinkets are to us now. To be able to date and title easily and almost instantly, each exposure as it is made; to identify them always—that is the motive in Autographic Photography.

It is not a part of the plan that the writing shall appear on the print itself, but it is obvious that it can easily be



included on the print, if desired.

The Autographic Kodak has a spring door in the back which is closed by a stop. This

little door covers the slot through which the writing is done on the red paper protecting the film. Any medium hard pencil, or the stylus which is provided for the purpose, can be used for writing the titles. The slot is so located as to bring the title into the margin between the exposures, when the number appears centered in the little red window. This brings the title at the bottom of an upright,


or at the left end of a horizontal negative.

When the data has been written on the red paper, and printed (by exposing with door open to the sky, but not the sun, for from one to five seconds) the record is photographically impressed on the film, and appears when the film strip is developed.

For the average requirements, this little Kodak is fitted with tested meniscus achromatic lens.


Where microscopic definition and clearness in details are desired, the fully corrected Kodak Anastigmat f. 7.7 lens is supplied.

The Kodak Ball Bearing shutter works without jerk or jar. By pulling out the front as far as it will go, the camera is in focus. Has brilliant, reversible finder, and is fitted with Autotime Scale.

No. 1 Autographic Kodak Junior

It is fully equipped for efficient work in all branches of general amateur photography, and yet it is so thin and compact as to go easily into the pocket.

The No. 1 Junior makes 2½ x 3½ pictures and loads with Autographic Film


Cartridges of six exposures (No. A-120), permitting the recording of date and title

No. 1^A Autographic Kodak Junior

THE No. 1A Autographic Kodak Junior will please anyone who prefers pictures of the $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{4}$ size. It is so thin and compact as to readily slip into the pocket—so simple that anyone can operate it, and, withal, it is thoroughly reliable.

Like the No. 1 Junior, it possesses the Autographic feature—the new big thing in photography—permitting the writing of date and title on each picture. Twelve


ridges (No. A-116) may be used.

The shutter is the Kodak Ball Bearing with cable release, which works not only for bulb and time exposures, but has variable indicated speeds of 1/25, 1/50 and 1/100 of a second.

The camera may be brought to a focus quickly for objects at any distance, by an automatic focusing lock. Has new collapsible, reversible finder and two tripod sockets. Covered with seal grain leather, bellows of black leather, and nickel and black enamel fittings.

Nos. 1^A and 3 Autographic Kodaks





No.1 Autographic Kodak Special

In the No. 1 Autographic Special, we offer the same degree of perfection in a $2\frac{1}{4} \times 3\frac{1}{4}$ camera, as in the larger Special Kodaks. Smaller cameras for $2\frac{1}{4} \times 3\frac{1}{4}$ pictures, can be and are made, but not with an equivalent in lens and shutter capabilities. The lenses have the full speed at which they are listed, and the shutters are large enough to maintain that speed.

The regular equipment is the Zeiss Kodak Anastigmat, f. 6.3 lens and Optimo shutter, with cable release, highest


speed 1/300 of a second and variable speeds to one second, also "bulb" and time actions.

The back opens in the center, in a sliding motion, leaving both spools easily accessible for loading. In opening, the standard is drawn out to the 100 feet mark, and may be easily and quickly adjusted by a simple lever attachment, for all intermediate distances.

Has a new brilliant, reversible finder with adjustable window, black leather bellows, highly nickeled fittings and is covered with finest quality long grain calf.







Nos. 2 and 2^A Folding Pocket Brownies

THE Brownies have been called "little cousins of the Kodaks," for they are made in Kodak factories, by Kodak workmen, and have the daylight-all-theway features of the Kodaks.

The No. 2 is fitted with our Pocket Automatic shutter working for time, bulb and snap-shot exposures, in which is mounted an excellent meniscus lens.

These cameras are identical in construction and design, differing only in the size of pictures they make and in lens equipment. The No. 2A is fitted with meniscus achromatic lens, and its simple

operation and reliability, have made it one of the most popular cameras of the whole Brownie line.

For effective landscape composition and full and three-quarter length portraits, the shape of its pictures is ideal. And when fitted with Kodak Portrait Attachment, it may be operated close up to the subject for bust portraits.

Both cameras are carefully finished throughout, with imitation leather coverings and nickeled fittings.

It consists of a metal box, with cover, just long enough to accommodate a roll of No. 1 or No. 2 Brownie film in one loop. To develop, the roll of film is inserted in the spool carrier, and by means of a cord and winding shaft the film is unrolled and carried around a roller bearing, thus exposing the film to the action of the developer. The box is then rocked on its standard for six minutes, the developer poured off, film washed and removed for fixing.
