



### No. 1 Kodak Junior



THE Kodak Juniors are our latest models, built upon the idea of providing genuine daylight all-the-way Kodaks, with all the Kodak convenience and dependability, for those who wish to take up photography at a minimum of expense.

The No. 1 makes 2½ x 3½ pictures and loads with the Kodak Film cartridge of six exposures (No. 120). A striking feature of this camera is its extreme thinness and all-around compactness. It will readily slip into the pocket, and yet

it is fully equipped for efficient work in all branches of general amateur photography. It is fitted with the No. 0 Ball Bearing shutter, speed  $\frac{1}{50}$  of a second, with cable release, and offers the choice of rapid rectilinear or meniscus achromatic lens. All lenses fitted to this camera must stand the usual rigid Kodak tests.

The camera is well made in every respect, it is covered with a good quality of grain leather, and the metal parts are finished in nickel and black enamel.

### No. 1A Kodak Junior



WITH its strikingly thin, compact form, its reliable equipment and its low cost, the No. 1A Kodak Junior is sure to please anyone who prefers pictures of the  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{4}$  size.

The shutter is the Kodak Ball Bearing with cable release, which works not only for bulb and time exposures, but has variable indicated speeds of  $\frac{1}{25}$ ,  $\frac{1}{50}$  and  $\frac{1}{100}$  second.

The camera is furnished with either meniscus achromatic or rapid rectilinear lens. In either case the lens is carefully tested and must conform to the high Kodak standard before it is allowed to go on the camera.

Simplicity marks this camera in every respect. It is made with the new style back—unusually easy to remove for loading and unloading. It has an automatic focusing lock, collapsible finder, two tripod sockets, and the camera is finished in most attractive style.



### Nos. 1 and 1A Folding Pocket Kodaks



THESE little Kodaks are designed for those who wish compact folding cameras which can be easily carried in the pocket and which will make pictures without the necessity of focusing or estimating distances.

Upon opening the camera the front springs automatically into position, ready at once for making pictures of objects at any distance. A reversible finder makes composition easy, and slight pressure of the shutter lever makes the exposure.

These cameras are fitted with tested meniscus achromatic lenses and automatic shutters, working for time, bulb and

"snap-shot" exposures.


When closed the bed folds over front and bellows, concealing all adjustments, and the camera can then be very conveniently carried in any coat pocket. The camera is made of aluminum, with best seal grain leather covering and has nickel fittings. They differ only in the size of the pictures they make and are highly reliable, well made cameras in every respect.

size which it is possible to get of the



# No. 3A Folding Pocket Kodak



THE 3½ x 5½ (post card size) picture is considered by many amateurs as the most desirable size of all. Its shape is admirable, in the horizontal position, for landscapes, street or water scenes, and the like, while vertically, it is ideal for full length or bust portraits.

The first camera made for this popular post card size—the 3A Folding Pocket Kodak—has come to be recognized as the standard for all cameras, and every

# Special Kodaks

### The Brownies

SIMPLE, sturdy, reliable, the Brownies have stood the test of years and will be found in the hands of thousands of people all over the world, who are making perfectly satisfactory pictures with them.

The first Brownie, the No. 1, was originally made for the children, and it produced such good pictures in their hands, as to excite the interest of the grown-up people. The success obtained by its use created a demand for similar inexpensive, simple cameras for pictures of larger size.

And so the line of Brownies has grown, until now they can be had in all the pop-

ular amateur sizes.

Brownies use the regular N. C. Kodak film cartridges, and hence offer the daylight-all-the-way feature of the Kodaks. In fact, they are so closely related to the Kodaks, being made in the Kodak factories, by Kodak workmen, that they well deserve the name "little cousins of the Kodaks."

For those who wish to take up photography at the minimum of expense, the Brownies offer a varied choice of cameras with years of success and the reputation of the Kodak factories behind them.

### No. 0 Brownie



THE longer, narrower picture is becoming more and more popular every year. The  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{4}$  and  $3\frac{1}{4} \times 5\frac{1}{2}$  sizes, and more recently the  $1\frac{5}{8} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$  (the Vest Pocket size) offer opportunities for especially artistic compositions, which the amateur photographer has been quick to

appreciate.

And so we have just added a new little camera to the Brownie line. It makes 15 x 2½ pictures, it is perfectly reliable in every respect, it is strongly constructed to stand hard knocks, it is so simple that any school boy can easily use it, and it will make pictures under ordinarily favorable conditions, that will satisfy even the very particular amateur photographer.

An important feature in connection with the camera is the ease with which larger pictures can be made from its negatives. By use of the Vest Pocket Kodak Enlarging Camera any amateur can enlarge a No. 0 Brownie negative to the 3½ x 5½ size. Or, if preferred, the finisher will do it at slight expense. And enlargements of greater size can be had if wanted, such is the quality of the negatives which this little camera will make.

The No. 0 Brownie has automatic shutter for time and snap shot exposures, tested meniscus lens, two finders, and the daylight-all-the-way feature of the Kodaks.

The extremely low price at which the camera is furnished, considering the care put into its construction, and the rigid tests which each camera must stand, is possible only through the large quantities in which they are made and the perfection of the Kodak factory system.

# No. 2 Brownie Developing Box
